1 Thessalonians 5:1-6 - The End

If we knew when the end of our life would be, we could get ready for it. We could have our wills prepared, our possessions disposed, funeral arrangements made, and goodbyes said. We would also have plenty of time to repent for the sin we had committed.

Evildoers would also know how much time they still had to commit sin before they needed to repent.

God does not give us this information. We do not know when our life will end or when Christ will come again. God's hope is that we would be ready all the time, and that we would live each day as if it were our last.

The First Letter to the Thessalonians says, "You yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief at night."

God's day will come suddenly, when we do not expect it, and it will rob us of what we hold dear, as a thief does at night.

Throughout the month of November we reflect on the end—the end of the church year and the end of life. It is a mournful time, but a beautiful time. We remember all the saints and all the souls of the faithful departed. We thank God for the fruits of the earth, and we prepare ourselves for the eternal harvest in heaven. We do not know when it is coming, but we want to be ready.

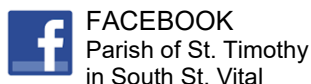
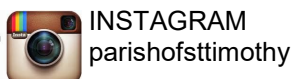

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR - NOVEMBER 19, 2017

This Sunday is the first 'World Day of the Poor'. Pope Francis has instituted this new day as a way of inviting us to understand that sharing with those living in poverty "enables us to understand the deepest truth of the Gospel". In his message for the World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis asks all of us, whatever our means, to unite in love and in acts of service to one another. He explains: "It is my wish that ... Christian communities will make every effort to create moments of encounter and friendship, solidarity and concrete assistance." Please consider how you can create moments of encounter and friendship today.

HERE ARE 5 WAYS YOU CAN OBSERVE THE WORLD DAY OF THE POOR:

1. PRAY FOR THE POOR.

There are so many people who need our prayers. If you're overwhelmed and not sure where to start, try praying with your on-line newsfeed or newspaper. As you see headlines about what's happening around the world, pause and pray for the people affected by those stories.

2. PRACTICE THE CORPORAL WORKS OF MERCY.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are drawn from Jesus' life and teachings. They call us to: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, visit the sick and imprisoned, bury the dead and give alms to the poor. Pope Francis added a new work of mercy: to care for God's creation. The Corporal Works of Mercy offer a clear model and starting point for how to care for our neighbours in need.

3. MAKE CARING FOR THE POOR PART OF YOUR ROUTINE.

Do you buy coffee, chocolate or Christmas gifts? One way to support low-income workers around the world is by buying things you use on a regular basis from organizations that pay a fair wage. If you drink coffee or tea, look for a fair trade label, which means that the farmers who harvest the coffee or tea are paid fairly and work in safe conditions. As you begin your Christmas shopping, consider buying gifts from around the world that are produced and traded ethically.

4. LEARN ABOUT THE CAUSES OF POVERTY AND WORK TO CHANGE THEM.

There are many reasons why people around the world are trapped in poverty: lack of jobs, war and climate change that affects what farmers can grow are only a few examples. We can raise our voices together to ask our government to support policies that help address these causes of poverty. Look into Development and Peace <https://www.devp.org/>

5. SUPPORT THE CHURCH'S OUTREACH TO THE POOR.

You don't have to look far to see the needs of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul (SSVP) in our very own parish. Their needs include: food and monetary donations, help with food delivery, phone calls to set up deliver times and stocking the larder...just a few ways you can help SSVP. Our Refugee Committee continues to support our newcomer family plus others in our city that require supportive visits, and often furniture, warm clothing and baby items & always appreciate more help.
